Joanna is employed at Texas State University. Joanna became involved with the Texas Association for Clinical Laboratory Science (TACLS) as a student. She was voted the Student Forum Chair and represented Region VII at Legislative Day in Washington DC. Since this time, Joanna continued to be very active in the state organization. She has been a TACLS Board member, President-Elect, President, Past President, and Membership Committee Chair. She has served as the Co-Webmaster for the state organization and has played a vital role in bringing the TACLS website into the 21<sup>st</sup> century and has been a state convention committee member and chaired the 2013 TACLS Annual meeting.

Joanna's passion has been in leading the organization in the fight for licensure for laboratorians. She has testified before the State Legislature, the Sunset Commission and written dozens of letters to Senators and Representatives. Ms. Ellis is a graduate of the ASCLS Leadership Academy. She has promoted the profession to the public by publishing articles regarding laboratory testing, mentoring and networking. Joanna does not limit her activities to the profession but also found time to participate in community and civic organizations that support her daughter's interests.
