

This year, ASCLS is proud to honor and acknowledge the efforts of Mindy Ingalls, MLS(ASCP)^{CM}, PBT(NHA)^{CM}, from Colorado.

Mindy is currently working as a medical laboratory scientist in the Microbiology Department at Porter Hospital in Colorado, AdventHealth's hub for all microbiology tests in the Rocky Mountain Region. As a first-generation college graduate, Mindy is proud to reflect on the accomplishments she has made during her university education, which was disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Shortly after joining the MLS program at Denver Health, Mindy immediately became involved in ASCLS. She joined ASCLS-Colorado as the Developing Professional (DP) representative in April of 2024. With this position, Mindy sought to fill open board positions, update the ASCLS-CO website, reactivate the Facebook page, establish an Instagram page, organize monthly social events, and design t-shirts to enhance laboratory visibility. To her surprise, Mindy was able to



accomplish these six tasks within the first year of her involvement. Additionally, Mindy has presented the "ABCs of the FDA and LDTs" for ASCLS-CO's fall seminar.
